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15 Years of OrchKids

When Marin Alsop joined the BSO in 2007, she wanted to create a music program that engaged with the diverse communities of Baltimore. She planned to build a program that offered equitable access to music, especially instrumental music, and used music as a vehicle for students to develop 21st century skills (creativity, collaboration, leadership, etc.) that would be transferable to all areas of their lives. With this vision, Marin Alsop (Music Director Laureate of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and OrchKids Founding Director) shaped OrchKids into the cornerstone of the BSO's community engagement efforts across the city.

OrchKids was founded a year later, in 2008, with 30 students at one elementary school with seed funding from Marin Alsop and Founding Donors Rheda Becker and Robert E. Meyerhoff. Over the years, OrchKids has been recognized on both national and local levels. This includes receiving the 2013 National Arts and Humanities Youth Program Award from former First Lady Michelle Obama, performing with the BSO during a Raven's half-time show as well as countless times at Joseph

Meyerhoff Symphony Hall, and features in multiple media outlets including PBS, the New York Times, 60 Minutes, and the Washington Post. OrchKids has served thousands of students in Baltimore, performed at countless venues across the city, and sent hundreds of students to prestigious summer music camps around the country.

In our 15th year, we are projected to serve 1,800 students at seven sites across the city. This year, we are excited to introduce a new framework for our after-school programs to provide deeper engagement for our students. This includes the introduction of private instruction, smaller group classes, and a greater emphasis on ensembles. Additionally, we will continue to provide service coordination to social services to help meet the needs of OrchKids students and families.

Summer at OrchKids

School was out for the summer, but OrchKids continued on! This year, we were thrilled to host our free summer program at Goucher College. Our summer program is a unique opportunity to bring students from all OrchKids sites across Baltimore together in a three week program. Instrumental students that attended the summer program received academic tutoring and book club, group lessons, enrichment class, breakfast and lunch, recess, ensemble sectionals, and ensemble rehearsals. We were also able to welcome our musicianship students (Pre-K through 3rd grade) back to summer programming for the first time since 2019. These students practiced songs, rhythms, and mindfulness, participated in violin and piano group lessons, and curbed summer learning loss with tutoring and arts integration.

In addition to regular programming, special events made Fridays extra fun. The first Fun Friday featured special guests BSO Artistic Partner Wordsmith, OrchKids Creative Partner John Tyler, and OrchKids Teaching Artist Rachel Winder leading a variety of creative workshops. The following Friday, students enjoyed popcorn and soda during a trip to the movies at The Senator Theatre. The final Fun Friday was one for the books. We kicked off the morning with an impressive talent show before getting ready for the main event - the summer concert! This concert showcased musicianship students, chamber music, a summer brass band, and wind and string ensembles. The audience was blown away by students' musicianship and energy. Attending an outside summer music camp allows students to learn from new, renowned teachers, build connections with professionals, form new friendships, become more independent, and fully immerse themselves in music.
